The heated discussion has roiled the prestigious department at a time when academia, along with virtually every other institution in American life, is scrutinizing its role in perpetuating discrimination against and exclusion of Black people.

The recent police killings of George Floyd, Breonna Taylor, and other Black Americans have galvanized weeks ~~of protests against police brutality and racism~~ all 50 states, triggered a flood of funding and support for the Black Lives Matter movement, resulted in ~~teardowns of Confederacy leader statues~~ and prompted ~~the resignations of corporate executives~~ with histories of racist behavior.

Astronomy as a field is overwhelmingly dominated by white men, and research shows that women especially women of color, face ~~greater risks of gendered and racial harassment~~ on the job. A ~~2018 survey~~ of the American Astronomical Society which includes undergraduates, graduate students, faculty members, and retired astronomers found that 82% of members identified as white and only 2% as Black or African American. Basu, the Yale astronomy department chair, did not answer questions about how many Black graduate students have graduated from the department, or how many Black faculty and staff it has employed. Across the university, ~~7%~~ of the student body identifies as Black or African American.
